

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Beloved in Christ,

For a long time, I have had the goal in mind of inviting as many of you as possible into praying the daily offices (Morning and Evening Prayer) and reading the whole witness of scripture. This year, we are introducing a reading plan, which includes some instruction on how to study the Bible, a comprehensive reading plan that will bring us through approximately half of the Old Testament and the entire New Testament one time.

This plan can be used one of two ways – you can do all the reading in the morning or evening, or you can do one reading in the morning one in the evening. My plan is to read on my own in the morning and do the evening one with my family, but you can adjust for what works best for you.

Our hope is to introduce you to the whole witness of scripture and emphasize the importance of worship in our daily lives. The lessons come from the M'Cheyne Reading Plan. Morning and Evening prayer are a truncated version of the 1928 prayer book Daily Offices.

Finally, our music director, Elizabeth, has compiled a list of hymns which can be sung at home as a family. We have many worn hymnals that will not be used in our pews but are great for family worship. Please ask for one or two for your home.

Some additional thoughts:

- 1. Read the "how to study the Bible" section.
- 2. Do not fret if you fall behind, just keep reading.
- 3. The end goal isn't to be able to brag about having read so much it is to know God better. So, take your time.
- 4. Remember our call is to: "hear scripture, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest" it. In other words: read it out loud, study it deeply, memorize it, and meditate upon it.
- 5. It's okay if this reading plan isn't right for you there is no one size fits all approach to the Word of God. This is simply a guide. If you need help finding a plan that will "fit you" talk to Fr. Ian or someone else in the parish for help.

It is our prayer – our church would continue to grow in the love and knowledge of God and that we would be a faithful witness here in the quad-city area to the goodness and grace of His son Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Tradition One-Month Psalm Cycle

How to pray the Psalter

There are a few manners in which you can pray the Psalms. For simplicity's sake we only provided you with one version. In the version on the next page, you will be given a handful of Psalms for morning and evening. If you follow this schedule you will pray the whole Psalter every month (except for February). You will simply pray the Psalms that are listed for that day of the month. On Months that have 31 days, you return to The Twenty-Seventh Day and pray those Psalms again.

I would recommend this way, but if you need to split the Psalms into smaller portions, you can do so by either reading a single Psalm at Morning or Evening Prayer, or by splitting up the days Psalms so you do the Morning Psalms one day and the Evening Psalms the following day.

You will also notice that later in the year some of the second readings are from the Psalter. In this case, read the Psalms as you would read any other text, do not simply pray them but study them and meditate upon them.

How to Study the Bible

- 1. Start with prayer: ask God to give you wisdom about this passage and that He would minister to you through His word.
- 2. Meditate upon his word: If time allows, read the passage multiple times, allow yourself to sit with what God is saying. 3. Consider context:
 - a.) Who was the original audience for this passage?
 - b.) What is going on in their community when this passage was written?
 - c.) What is the literary context? (what comes right before this? What about after it?)
 - d.) Are there any connections to other parts of scripture?
 - e.) What does this teach us about the nature of God?
 - f.) What does it teach us about human nature?

4. Live the Word:

- a.) What does this passage mean for today?
- b.) How should I respond? How is God using this passage in my life today?
- 5. You may wish to keep a journal with your Bible and this booklet. This will allow you to write down your thoughts, and process it in another way.

Memorizing Scripture

For many of you, it may be foreign to memorize scripture. However, I want to encourage you to give it a try. A professor of mine once said that "by memorizing scripture, we give the Holy Spirit a voice." The memorized word of God can be encouraging to us, help us stay grounded, and keep us focused on the labor for the kingdom. There are several ways you can memorize scripture. You can write it down on a sticky note or a card, so you can read it over and over again, or just refer back to it. Either way, I want to encourage you to try to develop the habit of making God's word internal to your mind and heart.



The Daily Offices

In the Anglican tradition our worship is guided by the Book of Common Prayer. At All Saints we use the 1928 American Book of Common Prayer. We have truncated Morning and Evening Prayer, but the structure is still similar to what we pray when we gather for worship during the week.

The daily offices are particularly important because they remind us of our need for Christ. They are rich in scripture, remind us to come before our Lord and confess our sins, the promise of forgiveness is given in Christ.



Morning Prayer

Opening sentence: THE LORD is in his holy temple: let all the earth keep silence before him. Hab. ii. 20.

Leader: Let us humbly confess our sins unto Almighty God

A General Confession (In Unison):

ALMIGHTY and most merciful Father; We have erred, and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep. We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts. We have offended against thy holy laws. We have left undone those things which we ought to have done; And we have done those things which we ought not to have done; And there is no health in us. But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders. Spare thou those, O God, who confess their faults. Restore thou those who are penitent; According to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord. And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake; That we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, To the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.

Silence for reflection/personal confession unto God.





GRANT, O Lord, that, in all our sufferings here upon earth for the testimony of thy truth, we may stedfastly look up to heaven, and by faith behold the glory that shall be revealed; and, being filled with the Holy Ghost, may learn to love and bless our persecutors by the example of thy first Martyr Saint Stephen, who prayed for his murderers to thee, O blessed Jesus, who standest at the right hand of God to succour all those who suffer for thee. our only Mediator and Advocate. Amen.

Saint John, Apostle and Evangelist

The Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany



The Fifth Sunday in Lent, commonly called Passion Sunday

WE beseech thee, Almighty God, mercifully to look upon thy people; that by thy great goodness they may be governed and preserved evermore, both in body and soul; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Sunday Next Before Easter, commonly called Palm Sunday

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, who, of thy tender love towards mankind, hast sent thy Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ, to take upon him our flesh, and to suffer death upon the cross, that all mankind should follow the example of his great humility; Mercifully grant, that we may both follow the example of his patience, and also be made partakers of his resurrection; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. LORD, we beseech thee to keep thy household the Church in continual godliness; that through thy protection it may be free from all adversities, and devoutly given to serve thee in good works, to the glory of thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Twenty-third Sunday after Trinity


